After the February Half-Term we will be introducing a more convenient way to pay for school visits, after school clubs and much more online, using a secure service called ParentPay.



20 is Plenty

The '20 is Plenty' scheme is run by Staffordshire County Council and encourages drivers to reduce their speed to a maximum of 20mph outside schools.

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Each term around 16 Staffordshire schools take part in the scheme, which is in place when pupils arrive at school in the morning and at home time in the afternoon. Speed Indication Devices (SIDs) which display the speed of a vehicle as it passes by are used to encourage drivers to slow down.

Helen Fisher, Cabinet Support Member for Highways and Transport at Staffordshire County Council said: "This is an important scheme that helps to keep school children and our roads amongst the safest in the country.

"We're in the eighth year of the scheme now and so far over 200 schools across the county have benefited from it. The campaign calls on drivers not to put pupils lives at risk by driving above 20 miles an hour when outside schools. The scheme is also encouraging more parents and children to walk and cycle to school which helps to reduce congestion at school times."

From January 2018, the '20 is Plenty' School SID will be outside Ryecroft along with 13 other schools within Staffordshire.



Ofsted

As you are aware, we were visited by Ofsted on Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd November 2017. We are delighted to be able to share the final report with you, which is extremely positive and reflects on the hard work, effort and determination that has gone into moving the school forward.

As you will see, the inspection also identifies areas for improvement and although we are tremendously pleased with our successes, there is so much more we want to achieve and develop for our pupils, in order to become an outstanding school. Parenting Support Groups

Please find below two support groups that take place every Thursday, starting from the 1st February 2018 for 6 weeks. These groups will take place at the Uttoxeter Fire Station. There is no need to book a place, just turn up on the day at the times listed below.

Mellow Parenting – 12.30pm – 2.30pm

This is a personal group that allows parents to discuss and reflect how their own experiences of being parented affects the here and now. A time to discuss about their relationships with their children now. Why we behave how we do. How to improve self-esteem. Dispel myths and beliefs about parenting and offer guidance to promote confidence in parents to progress to further Parenting groups such as family caring trust.



Family Caring Trust – 10.00am – 12.00 noon

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The programme offers weekly sessions to help parents 5 to 15 years old to improve their communication skills and create a framework of discipline and respect in their families. Useful in reducing tension, squabbling, tantrums and fighting, establishing clearer, more respectful parenting guidelines, and making children happier and more responsible. Now revised and redesigned for the Primary years (parents of children aged 5 – 15).

Bullying

To support the schools continuing work in helping to eliminate bullying, we have introduced an online bully box, which pupil and parents are now able to use. The email address is bullybox@ryecroft.staffs.sch.uk. Any concerns can be sent to this monitored email address and will be followed up in school.

This is something which pupils have requested, in addition to the other methods they already have available to them. These include: speaking to any adult in the school, writing a note to put in the Bully Box (which is located near reception) or speaking to a Ryecroft P.A.L.S.

Lost Property

Ryecroft Carpark

Could I please remind all parents / carers that the school carpark is for Ryecroft and Dove staff ONLY. Could all parents / carers please park outside the school grounds. This is to ensure there is no obstructions within the carpark and also for the safety of the students. Thanks.

Reminder - Changes to Penalty Notices for Absence from School

We have been informed by Staffordshire County Council that the following changes commenced on the **1st January 2018**.

Unauthorised Leave of Absence (term time)

ANY period of unauthorised leave may result in parents / carers receiving a penalty notice.

Persistent Lateness

If your child receives 10 unauthorised late marks (non-consecutive), parents / carers could receive a penalty notice.

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Period of time to measure persistent absence and lateness

If your child has had 10 days unauthorised absence, or is late 10 times over a twelve week period, parents / carers may receive a penalty warning notice and also potentially a fine.

Staffing change

Many of you will be aware that 2 years ago Mike Osborne-Town took on the role of building our Multi-Academy Trust as our CEO. As a result of his tireless work, within in just 2 years, we are now one of the 7 founder schools of the Uttoxeter Learning Trust Multi-Academy Trust. Our trust is passionate about ensuring high quality education and smooth transition for students from the age of 3 – 18. We would like to thank Mike for all of his work for our school and also for the Learning Trust.

Please see Mike Osborne-Town's letter below.

I will be stepping down as CEO of the Uttoxeter Learning Trust with effect from 1st May 2018. I will then have completed the two years I originally agreed to. The ULT is now firmly established, has a clear vision and improvement plan, that will go from strength to strength. The ULT Trustees will be advertising for my replacement in the near future.

It's been a wonderfully fulfilling, although consuming, two years working with you all and I think, together, we've developed something very special. I am hoping that I will be able to continue supporting the MAT, although in a voluntary capacity, in the future.

New Trustee Needed for the Uttoxeter Learning Trust

Want to give something back to help your local community? Have you the financial/audit experience and expertise required to lead the trustees in supporting and challenging the schools in the Uttoxeter Learning Trust? This is like the role of the chair of the finance committee of the school governors, but it covers all of the schools in the ULT multi-academy trust. The ULT Board of Trustees sits above the school Governing Bodies and holds all of the schools to account. Like a school governor, it is a voluntary, unpaid, but very responsible, role. You would be expected to chair the ULT Finance Committee at their half-termly meetings and to report back at the Board of Trustees meetings which are also half-termly. Both start at 5.30pm and last no longer than 2 hours. It's a challenging role, but very rewarding.

Attendance

If your child is poorly and unable to come to school, please ring the school office (01889 590394), or email (office@ryecroft.staffs.sch.uk). **The new rule from Educational Welfare is that you must call the school on each day of absence.** This is not only to ensure the safeguarding of your child, but also to save the time of the office staff ringing home chasing absent children.

This is part of the school's attendance and safeguarding policy. This also ensures that your child does not get an unauthorised absence in the register.

Could you also please ensure that the school have your correct contact details eg: changed address, telephone numbers etc. This information is vital in case of an emergency, or if your child becomes unwell during the school day.

Holiday Update

On the 6th April 2017, the Supreme Court ruled unanimously against the father who had won an earlier legal battle in relation to a fine imposed following a term-time holiday, which was taken without permission. The Magistrates' Court and the High Court had previously decided that the father had no

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case to answer because his daughter had attended school regularly, in that her attendance was over 90% for the academic year to date, as at the end of the period of unauthorised absence.

The Supreme Court however, disagreed, stating that 'regularly' did not mean 'evenly spaced' or 'sufficiently often' but instead 'in accordance with attendance rules'. A leave of absence may only be granted by the school in exceptional circumstances (Education Regulations 2006).

The most common response to an unauthorised leave of absence is a fixed penalty notice, which would be issued in Staffordshire by the local authority, depending on the local code of conduct, and which has a £60 / £120 limit (per parent / per child), depending on when the fine is paid. If the fine is paid, then no further action is necessary. Health and Safety Reminders

For health and safety reasons, only watches and one pair of stud earrings may be worn in school.

For future reference, if your child is thinking of having their ears / body pierced, could I please kindly request that this procedure is done over the 6 weeks summer holiday, to enable sufficient healing prior to returning to school. This is to enable your child to continue to take part in school sporting activities.

Any child who has recently had their ears / body pieced and is still unable to take the piecing out by themselves, will be excluded from PE until their piercings have completely healed. No plasters will be issued to cover piercings.

School Dinners

Please be reminded that school dinners are £2.15 per day, and cheques are to be made payable to Staffordshire County Council.

Children are able to pre-order their school dinner and sandwiches for the present day and / or the following day, by informing the kitchen staff directly at either breakfast club, or at break-times.
